And the Oil Stayed

The widow was in debt. Her sons were about to be taken by the creditor as bondmen. Elisha asked what he could do for her. "What do you have in the house?" (2 King 4:2). All she had was a pot of oil. He told her to borrow vessels. "do not gather just a few." As long as she had a vessel, the oil continued to pour. The oil ceased when she ran out of vessels.

God will fill as many vessels as we have. If our thinking is small, we will fill only a few. If our thinking is big, we will fill many. Paul said, "I have planted, Apollos has watered; but God gave the increase" (1 Cor. 3:6). Solomon said, "There is one who scatters, yet increases more; and there is one who withholds more than is right, but it tends to poverty. The generous soul will be made rich: and he who waters will also be watered himself" (Prov. 11:24-25). The person who doesn't scatter doesn't increase but rather tends toward poverty.

Will we set out the vessels in our life? If we scatter our talents and resources in God's service, he will give the increase, not for our personal use, but for his glory and praise. One of the most encouraging passages in the Bible is, "Case your bread upon the waters: for you will find it after many days" (Eccl. 11:1)

God Cares about Your Service



We love to argue over status and who gets the credit. We tend to view some tasks in the church work as bigger and as more important than others. So, we tend to focus on the preacher or the elders or other church leaders. Then, we tend to overlook other jobs which seem small and unimportant, such as

tending the nursery or cleaning the restrooms. However, all our "status" and "credit" issues are meaningless to God. He just cares about your service in the kingdom.

Whatever your ability, God values it. If all you can do is lay there, Like Aeneas, God can use you to convert a community. If all you can do is sew, God can use you to impact people who are in need. If all you can do is preach a sermon, God can use you to turn the world upside down. Whatever your talent, whether it looks big or small, God can use you to build up his church.

"And he gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ" (Eph. 4:11-12). Who would have thought a disabled man and a seamstress would have such an impact on the growth of the kingdom. But, as Paul reminds us, all of our works of service are before us to build up the body of Christ. The person who cleans the building is helping build the kingdom. The person who prepares the communion or takes communion to shut-ins is helping build the kingdom. God cares about your acts of service.
