The Death of Christ

The Bible says again and again that Christ died. But listen to the word of God itself: "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross" (Philippians 2:5-8). "But we see Jesus who was made a little lower than the angels, for the suffering of death crowned with glory and honor, that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone" (Hebrews 2:9).

For whom did Christ die? He died for every man as we have just noted in Hebrews 2:9. The Scriptures also tell us that He died for sinners. Listen" "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). But why did He die for sinners? To provide salvation and hope. We read: "Who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4). "The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9).

That means that someone died for you and me. Just think about it. Although we were sinners, and enemies of God, and not deserving of such grace and mercy, nevertheless, Christ was willing to leave heaven to come to this land of sin and sorrow and to die upon the cross that we might be saved and have the hope of eternal life (Romans 5:6, 7). How Wonderful! But just think, He likewise died for all of the world – yesterday, today, and tomorrow. How thankful we should be, and it should result in our obedience and faithfulness to Him. How could we do any less?
